

DISCOVER TRINITY'S GESE: Graded Examinations in Spoken English

Suitable for learners of all ages and abilities

Trinity's Graded Examinations in Spoken English (GESE) are one-to-one oral assessments of speaking and listening skills with a Trinity examiner. Available at 12 grades of proficiency from CEFR level pre-A1 to C2, they are suitable for all learners from beginner to advanced.

Focus on communicative skills

Trinity's GESE qualifications equip people with the English speaking and listening skills they need for life in the 21st century. Candidates typically range from schoolchildren and college students to mature learners wanting to improve their English for study, travel, employment or immigration purposes.

Trinity's GESE exams assess a range of speaking and listening skills and test what a candidate can actually do, rather than just what they know.

Preparation for GESE exams focuses on the development of authentic communicative skills and on building the confidence to use English in real life.

A qualification for every level

GESE qualifications are available at 12 grades of proficiency, grouped in four development stages:

Intermediate	Grades 7-9	B2 to B2++	
Advanced	Grades 10-12	C1 to C2	

All GESE grades, except pre-A1, have been formally calibrated to the Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR).

Key features

- Motivational: The opportunity to gain qualifications in achievable steps inspires learners to progress.
- Personalised: Candidates prepare a topic of their own choice in advance of their exam, as the basis of an interactive discussion with the examiner.
- Expert examiners: Trinity examiners are trained to put students at ease and encourage them to perform at their best.
- Diagnostic feedback: Trinity provides a free 30-minute examiner feedback session on students' overall exam performance (for in-person examiner visits only).
- Supports teaching: GESE is designed to support classroom teaching and maps easily to general English language curricula and coursework.
- Exam preparation: Trinity provides clear exam specifications, guidance and support, plus free online teaching and learning resources.
- Inclusive: There is a GESE grade for every learner whatever their proficiency stage, nationality or cultural context.
- Early results: Early provisional results are available before certificates are issued to successful candidates.
- Exam options: GESE exams are available as face-toface in-person examiner sessions or online sessions via video conference.

At each stage of proficiency, candidates carry out a number of speaking and listening tasks that show their fluency, accuracy and ability to communicate in spoken English.

About the exam tasks

- Conversation (all grades): An opportunity for the candidate to demonstrate their ability to exchange information, ideas and opinions at an appropriate level for the grade.
- ▶ Topic (Grades 4-12): Before the exam, the candidate prepares a topic of their own choice. This is used as the basis for an interactive discussion and as the basis of a formal presentation at Advanced level.
- Interactive task (Grades 7-12): A prompt from the examiner initiates candidate-led interactions requiring an authentic and spontaneous exchange of information and opinions.
- Listening task (Grades 10-12): Short spoken passages prompt the candidate to demonstrate skills of prediction, deduction and inference.

Learning progression

As they move up the grades, GESE candidates undertake tasks that require a more advanced use of language. Progress is typically characterised by:

- increased evidence of communicative abilities
- use of more demanding language functions, grammar, lexis and phonology
- increased candidate independence showing they can initiate and take control of interactions.
